The generous grant from the Joanna Foundation helped us cover general operating expenses at Trident Literacy, such as instructor salaries, classroom space, and textbooks for the 2022-2023 academic year participants.

The total student count was 363, including participants and reportables. 44.6% of the ABE and GED Preparation participants showed at least one educational functioning level gain, and 54.8% ESL participants increased their educational function level. Seventeen participants successfully earned their GED.

### **Student Story**

De Quan had trouble staying in school and dropped out at age 17. He came to us because he felt like his life would be on the wrong path if he didn't finish school and get his GED. After successfully passing all four sections of the GED, he said, "Now that I have it, I can say it feels amazing!". Now, his goal is to pass the ASVAB and become a successful leader in the US military.

The Joanna Foundation's general operating support allows us to provide quality education to adults who have struggled in more traditional academic institutions. Most adult basic education models enroll students in classes with an inflexible schedule that lasts hours. Our model is more effective for adults facing multiple barriers because we work with students in a more flexible environment with appointments or drop-in hours coupled with one-on-one targeted curriculum and tutoring that work more efficiently for our adult participants. While it is a more costly model, our case management approach helps participants, especially those facing generational poverty and illiteracy, succeed when it was previously unattainable. For our ESL participants, we add critical infrastructure to support the inadequate resources for immigrants in our community. Without the support of the Joanna Foundation, students would not have the option to go outside of state-funded adult education models that cannot serve them.






