Dear Joanna Foundation,

The Joanna Foundation's \$2,500 grant helped Young Moms Together (formerly Florence Crittenton Programs of South Carolina) continue advancing a transformational shift in how we serve pregnant and parenting young women experiencing homelessness, poverty, and trauma. The funding supported both direct services and organizational efforts to create more stable, family-centered, and accessible pathways to care for young mothers and their children.

During this grant period, significant progress was made toward the goals outlined in our original request:

- Successfully transitioned from our historic institutional-style facility into two family-style residential homes designed to create safer, more nurturing environments for young mothers and babies
- Expanded our housing and community-based support model to better serve young families across South Carolina
- Implemented and strengthened our Success Coach model, ensuring young mothers receive consistent, individualized support throughout their journey
- Advanced a “no wrong door” approach that reduces barriers to care and improves continuity of services
- Increased organizational capacity through a \$1 million investment from The Duke Endowment to support program evolution and implementation of the Success Coach framework
- Secured approximately \$700,000 through the federal Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) to provide rental assistance and supportive services for young moms ages 18–24
- Raised \$675,000 toward our broader transformation campaign, allowing us to renovate and furnish both homes while building long-term sustainability

The Joanna Foundation's support contributed to meaningful outcomes for young mothers by helping us provide:

- Stable housing and safer living environments
- Trauma-informed coaching and parenting support
- Connections to prenatal care, education, employment, and childcare resources
- Greater continuity of care through trusted relationships with staff
